

Mark J. Eanes, M.D., M.B.A.



Dr. Mark Eanes is a board-certified ophthalmologist who has practiced in Valdosta, GA for 37 years. In addition to being on staff at South Georgia Medical Center, other past **medical affiliations** include the clinical faculty at Medical College of Georgia, Veterans Administration Hospital; and credentialed to practice medicine by the Peruvian Ministry of Defense.

He received his undergraduate degree in biology from Valdosta State University. His **medical degree**, **medical internship and ophthalmology residency** were completed at Medical College of Georgia, Augusta, and his **MBA for Physician Executives** at Kennesaw State University in Kennesaw, Georgia.

He has served in many leadership roles locally, including

Lowndes County Board of Health since 1993, chairman since 1994. As an active staff member of South Georgia Medical Center since 1986, he has served on many committees and held several positions, including Chairman of the Executive Committee and Chief of Staff. He has been involved in community organizations such as Leadership Lowndes, Boy Scouts of America, YMCA sports programs; and he has been a member of two school boards. He has also served as President of the VSU Alumni Association. Dr. Eanes has been involved in local not-for-profit organizations, including serving on the boards of The Mailbox Club and Options Now (crisis pregnancy center) where he has twice served as President of the Board of Directors.

Leadership on a state level includes many positions in the Georgia Society of Ophthalmology, serving as president in 1996-97. He has been on the Board of Directors of the Medical Association of Georgia, including the MAG Council of Legislation. He is currently on the Board of Managers and Finance Committee of Live Oak Accountable Care Organization (ACO) and has held key positions in the South Georgia Physician Network. He chaired the Board of Directors and served as interim CEO of South Georgia Health Partners (MCO) and has been involved in the South Georgia Medical Society, Georgia Health Decisions, Medical Resource Network, South Georgia Physician/Hospital Organization and Georgia Society to Prevent Blindness.

Because of his **compassion for the poor and impoverished populations**, Dr. Eanes established Heaven In Sight Missions in 2006, which has provided humanitarian relief in at least 16 developing countries around the world, serving in many of these countries multiple times. Heaven In Sight occasionally partners with other nation-wide organizations to further impact the under-served.

Dr. Eanes now considers the opportunity to help the under-served population locally a privilege, and he is looking forward to the contribution he can make to improve the overall health of Georgians, building upon the tremendous foundations of the passionate staff and leadership of South Health District.

Call to Order

• Mr. Maxwell called the meeting to order at 12:12 p.m. and offered prayer.

Public Comments

• There were no public comments.

Approval of December 15, 2022 Minutes (Attached)

• Mrs. Brinson made a motion to approve the minutes from the December 15, 2022 meeting. The motion was seconded by Dr. Reed. All were in favor and the motion passed.

New Business:

Financial Information – Teresa Giles (Attached)

- Ms. Giles presented the Brooks County Health Department's Revenue and Expense Summary for July 2022 January 2023.
- The budget has been revised and increased by \$1,872 to reflect funding received from the state.
- The budget is approximately 58% spent with spending and revenue on track.
- Dr. Grow added Brooks has approximately three and a half months of operating funds available.
- The Brooks County Board of Health's FY2022 Audit Report was presented. Ms. Giles informed the Board there were no material weaknesses and no issues of noncompliance. Brooks has an unassigned fund balance of \$156,492, which will cover approximately three and a half months of operating expenses.
- Mr. Maxwell indicated he will work on increasing contributions to the health department.

(Dr. Horne arrives at 12:20 p.m.)

 After a brief discussion, Mrs. Furney made a motion to accept the Brooks County Health Department's FY2022 Audit Report. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Brinson. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Public Health Updates - William R. Grow, MD, FACP

- Dr. Grow provided the most current COVID update, indicating numbers have declined across the board, noting COVID is now considered endemic with the probability of a yearly vaccination being offered similar to the flu.
- The Board was informed of Dr. Grow's decision to retire as district health director in June. The position has been posted and two candidates have already applied. Board chairs will be contacted to schedule a meeting with the selected applicant and subsequently asked for a vote to approve the selection. The vote must be unanimous.
- Dr. Grow invited the Board to the Georgia Public Health Association's 93rd Annual Meeting and Conference scheduled for May 3-5, 2023 on Jekyll Island.
- Board members expressed their gratitude for Dr. Grow's service to the Brooks County community.

Nurse Manager's Report - Lisa Thomas, RN, MSN (Attached)

- Mrs. Thomas introduced Ebony Stone as the Administrative Support Supervisor at the Brooks County Health Department as of February 1, 2023, and provided an updated of Brooks County Health Department activities since the last meeting.
- Staff from other health departments have volunteered to provide clinical services and other support to the current staff. This has been a good experience for other staff to come outside their own clinics.
- COVID testing and vaccinations are now by appointment so vaccine will not be wasted.
- Over the next two weeks, a method to dispose of medications will be in place.
- The Board was informed the water leak has been resolved at the health department.
- The fire department performed an annual inspection February 8, 2023 and gave the health department a passing score.
- The clinic was partially closed to allow staff to attend career day at the high school.
- A Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) presentation was made to five classes at the high school February 28 March 1, 2023.
- One administrative support employee has begun vital records training. Brooks will resume issuing birth certificates March 1, 2023.

Environmental Health Update - Shannon Walker (Attached)

- Mr. Walker provided information about the Seven Rivers Council program, which provides assistance for qualified homeowners to repair or replace well or septic systems.
- Brooks' environmental health activity reports were also provided for board review.

Mission: To implement a sustainable, collaborative, and multi-disciplinary approach in response to Georgia's opioid and substance misuse crisis.

Vision: To improve access to state and local data; to recommend and/or implement education best practices; and to promote the use of law enforcement, healthcare, and public health resources to prevent the misuse of opioids and other substances in Georgia.

Opioid-Related Overdose Deaths Between 2017 – 2021, there were a total of 5 opioid-related overdose deaths for Brooks county.



Opioid-Related Overdose ER Visits

Between 2017 – 2021, there were a total of 28 opioid-related overdose ER visits for Brooks county.

- 78.6% White American
- 21.4% African American
- 42.9% Male
- 57.1% Female



Public Health Emergency

June 2017 – First public health response to overdose cluster in Macon, GA due to fake Percocets laced with U-47700 and cyclopropyl fentanyl.

October 2017 – Former President Trump and Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) declare opioid crisis a public health emergency.



Surveillance Activities

Syndromic Surveillance – Detection system reporting to DPH via hospitals based on patient's chief complaint and/or discharge diagnosis.

Vital Records and hospital reporting via DPH.

ODMAP – Application for law enforcement and first responders to report suspected overdose data across jurisdictions in near real time to support public safety and public health efforts in hopes to mobilize an immediate response to a sudden increase, or spikes in overdose events. The use of ODMAP by partnering agencies will bridge gaps in data collection.



Prescription Drug Monitoring Program

The Georgia Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) is an electronic database used to monitor the prescribing and dispensing of controlled substances. The PDMP provides prescribers and pharmacists with critical information regarding a patient's controlled substance prescription history. It can help eliminate duplicative prescribing and overprescribing of controlled substances and protect patients at risk of misuse.



Naloxone Standing Order

Issued by DPH Commissioner Kathleen Toomey. Naloxone is available for all residents of the state of Georgia to ensure that family members, friends, co-workers, first responders, schools, harm reduction organizations, and others are able to provide assistance to a person experiencing an opioid-related overdose.



GA 911 Medical Amnesty Law

Any person who in good faith seeks medical assistance for a person experiencing or believed to be experiencing a drug overdose shall not be arrested, charged, or prosecuted for a drug violation if the evidence for the arrest, charge, or prosecution of such drug violation resulted solely from seeking medical assistance. Any person who is experiencing a drug overdose and, in good faith, seeks medical assistance for himself/herself or is the subject of such a request shall not be arrested, charged, or prosecuted for a drug violation if the evidence for the arrest, charge, or prosecution of such drug violation resulted solely from seeking such medical assistance.
